WHAT IS FLAMENCO?

MUSIC AND DANCE FROM SPAIN

Flamenco is a music and dance tradition that formed in southern Spain (Andalusia) in the 19th century from a mix of Spanish, Moorish, Sephardic Jewish, West & North African, and Latin American traditions.

Though most people think of the intense dance (baile), known for its footwork and castanet playing, flamenco also includes the singing (cante), guitar (toque), and rhythmic handclaps (palmas).

Many of flamenco's songs come from the laborers and artisans of southern Spain who expressed their lives through this exuberant folk tradition. Flamenco is traditionally an improvised form.

Nowadays, flamenco can be seen all over the world, from small family gatherings to the world's largest stages.
